



RESIDENTIAL COLLEGE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

RC FIRST-YEAR SEMINAR (RCCORE 100)

First-Year Seminar which is the RC equivalent of LS&A's Introductory Composition course.

SECOND LANGUAGE

SECOND LANGUAGE THROUGH PROFICIENCY LEVEL AND A LANGUAGE SEMINAR in the RC--or the equivalent in a language not offered in the RC.

INTENSIVE LANGUAGE I (8 hrs. credit)
INTENSIVE LANGUAGE II (8 hrs. credit)
PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION
READINGS IN LANGUAGE (4 hrs. credit)

Upon completion of the above series, the RC Language Requirement is fulfilled.

DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT (Identical to LSA)

CANDIDATES FOR THE A.B. OR B.S. DEGREE MUST FULFILL THE AREA DISTRIBUTION REQUIREMENT WITH 30 CREDITS OF COURSES ELECTED FROM OUTSIDE THE FIELD OF CONCENTRATION.

Students must complete 7 credits in each of the following three areas: Natural Science (NS), Social Science (SS), and Humanities (HU).

Students must also complete 3 additional credits in three of the following six areas: (NS), (SS), (HU), Mathematical and Symbolic Analysis (MSA), Creative Expression (CE) and Interdisciplinary (ID) for a total of 9 credits. Credits in courses designated Interdisciplinary (ID) may be used to satisfy up to 9 credits of this part of the requirement.

ARTS PRACTICUM

THE ARTS PRACTICUM REQUIREMENT INVOLVES HANDS-ON EXPERIENCE IN THE ARTS, such as music, drama, creative writing, studio art, and dance. This requirement may be met by course work or significant experience in a particular field of art. (Courses that count toward the Creative Expression distribution requirement, automatically satisfy the Arts Practicum requirement.)

**LIVE-IN REQUIREMENT**

STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO LIVE IN EAST QUAD DURING THEIR FIRST AND SECOND YEARS.

Students are strongly encouraged to complete the requirements listed above during their first two years. Other plans for progress should be discussed with an RC Academic Advisor. Additional requirements are listed below.

RACE OR ETHNICITY REQUIREMENT (Identical to LSA)

As of the Fall Term of 1991 all students in LS&A (including the Residential College) must meet the Race or Ethnicity (ROE) requirement. The requirement is fulfilled with satisfactory completion, at some point before graduation, of one course from a list of approved courses published each term in the LS&A online Course Guide.

QUANTITATIVE REASONING REQUIREMENT (Identical to LSA)

Beginning with the entering class of Fall 1994, all students in LS&A (including the Residential College) must meet a Quantitative Reasoning (QR) requirement. The requirement is fulfilled with satisfactory completion, at some point before graduation, of one course (or, in certain instances, two courses) selected from a list of approved courses published each term in the LS&A online Course Guide. *It will be important to consult with an academic advisor to select appropriate course work.*

UPPER-LEVEL WRITING REQUIREMENT (Identical to LSA)

ONE COURSE DESIGNATED TO MEET THIS REQUIREMENT MUST BE ELECTED AFTER COMPLETION OF THE FIRST YEAR COMPOSITION COURSE. See the RC Time Schedule and the listing in the LSA Course Guide for a list of designated courses. You must modify the course as ULWR to meet this requirement at the time you register.

TOTAL RC COURSES

STUDENTS WHO INTEND TO GRADUATE WITH AN RC/LSA DEGREE ARE EXPECTED TO COMPLETE AT LEAST 4 RC COURSES BEYOND COMPLETION OF THE FIRST-YEAR SEMINAR AND THE RC SECOND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT, IF THEY DO NOT HAVE A CONCENTRATION IN THE RC.

CONCENTRATION

STUDENTS MAY DECLARE A CONCENTRATION IN AN RC CONCENTRATION PROGRAM OR LSA DEPARTMENT OR PROGRAM, AND MAY PURSUE MORE THAN ONE CONCENTRATION. ELIGIBLE STUDENTS MAY PURSUE AN HONORS CONCENTRATION IN ANY OF THE FIVE RC CONCENTRATION



PROGRAMS, OR IN LSA. RC students are NOT required to complete one of the RC concentrations, unless they transfer into the College at the Junior level. The five RC concentrations are interdisciplinary, and are: Arts and Ideas in the Humanities, Creative Writing, Drama, Social Science, and an Individualized Concentration Program (ICP). In addition, all LSA concentrations (except LSA ICPs) are available to RC students.

TOTAL CREDIT HOURS

A MINIMUM OF 120 HOURS OF CREDIT IS REQUIRED FOR A BACHELOR OF ARTS OR BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE (the RC does not offer the Bachelor of General Studies [BGS] degree). For a Bachelor of Science degree 60 of the 120 hours must be in approved physical and natural sciences and/or mathematics classes. See the LSA online Course Guide for a list of approved courses offered each term.
